 apparell and all my remaining property of every
 kind whatsoever that I may be possessor of at the
 time of my decease to the above said Mrs Sarah
 Plym and Mary Lowe to be equally divided ee
 between them share and share alike but it is
 my wish for Mrs Plym to take what part of my ee
 wearing Apparell she pleases & so Sarah to
 be my last will and Testament unto which I set
 my hand the 21st of Dorothy Bailey Tuticford
 this fourteenth day of March 1605 in the presence
 of Thomas Bailey George Braungrove witnesses

On the fourth day of May in the year of our
 Lord one thousand six hundred and three I have
 with the will annexed of all and singular the
 Goods Chattels and Curtils of Dorothy Haverwick ee
 Dorothy Bailey late of the parish of St Andrew in
 the County of Middlesex widow deceased was granted
 to Mary Lowe Spinster one of the Executors named
 named in the said will (no Executor being therein
 named) the having been first sworn duly to administer

 this 2^d day of Oct^r 1602 first I owe all my ee
 debts and funeral expenses and the probat
 of this my will to be paid I give to my ee
 daughter Elizabeth Broadhurst thirty pounds in

 under the same control as her third share herein
 after mentioned I give to my daughter in law
 Mary Broadhurst my Grand son Tho^s Broadhurst
 my Grand daughter Bailey Broadhurst my
 Grand daughter Anne Broadhurst five Guineas
 each I give to the Gentlemen who have the ee
 Management of the School at Durbford five
 pounds for the use of that Charity all the ee
 Residue and Remainder of my real and personal
 Estates I give and devise to my sons William
 Broadhurst and James Broadhurst on Trust
 as follows viz one third share to my son William
 Broadhurst one other third share to my son James

Broadhurst to be by my sons William Broadhurst and
James Broadhurst laid out by them in their joint names
in the three parts out of the said annuities and the interest
thereof as it becomes due during the life of my daughter
Elizabeth Broadhurst to be paid either to her or for her
use and benefit as they may from time to time think
proper and after an account the said share to be
equally divided between my three said children the
Broadhurst Emily Broadhurst and Anna Broadhurst I
do nominate and appoint my sons William Broadhurst and
James Broadhurst Trustees and Executors of this my will
The Broadhursts.

that they have and were well acquainted with the
Reverend Thomas Broadhurst late of the City of Chester
Clerk deceased and with his Writings and Characters of
said writing and Subscription bearing frequently
him write and also write and subscribe his name and
the deponents bearing now carefully viewed and
perused the paper writing hereto annexed purporting
to be and contain the last will and Testament of the
said deceased beginning thus "I Tho: Broadhurst of the
City of Chester Clerk do make this my will this 2nd day
of Oct: 1802" ending thus "I nominate and appoint my
sons William Broadhurst and James Broadhurst
Trustees and Executors of this my will" and thus
subscribed "Tho: Broadhurst the deponents lastly
made oath that they verily and in their Conscience
believe the whole Tenor and contents of the
said will beginning and ending as aforesaid and also
the name Tho: Broadhurst thereto set and
subscribed as aforesaid to be of the proper hand writing
and subscription of the said Reverend Thomas Broadhurst
Clerk deceased viz: Pitts Esq: Emanuel Broughton some day the
said Elizabeth Pitts and Emanuel Broughton were duly
shown to the Truth of this Affidavit before me G Godke

This Will was proved at London on the
fifth day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand
eight hundred and three before the Worshipful John
Sewell Doctor of Laws Surrogate of the Right
Honorable Sir William Armitage Knight also Doctor
of Laws Master Recorder or Commissioner of the

procurator Court of Canterbury lawfully exhibited by
the Oathes of William Woodbridge and James
Woodbridge the Son of the deceased and the executors
named in the said will to whom Justice of all and
singular the Goods Chattels and Credits of the said
deceased was granted they having been first sworn
duely to adm^y

This is the last Will Susannah

and Testament of me Susannah Brook of Woodbridge
in the County of Suffolk Widow first of give and bequeath
the sum of one hundred pounds to Susan Dumett
my Grand daughter to be paid to her when she
arrives at the age of twenty one years and the
interest in the mean time to go towards her
Maintenance and Education and all the Rest
Residue and Remainder of my personal Estate
except my Household furniture plate linen and
China after payment of my debts I give and bequeath
unto and amongst my three Children equally
William Edward Susan Dumett and Betsy the
wife of Samuel Barret to be equally divided
between them share and share alike as soon as
conveniently may be after my decease in which
said personal Estate I include all my share and
interest in a certain annuity of eight pounds per
annum purchased by me in the Imperial annuity
for the Remainder of the Term of twenty five
years that shall be to come at the time of my
decease I give all my Household furniture
plate linen and China I give and bequeath
unto my two daughters the said Susan Dumett
and Betsy Barret to be equally divided
between them share and share alike and I
nominate and appoint William Edward Dumett
my Son in law sole Executor of this my will
and lastly revoking all former wills I declare
this to be my last will and Testament in
witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this twenty ninth day of January in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred
and three I Brook signed sealed published
and declared by the said Testatrix Susannah
Brook as and for her last will and Testament
in the presence of us who in her presence at her
Request and in the presence of each other have
subscribed our Names as witnesses hereto
