of at the time of my decease and all monies that may be due to me
whatsoever or whatsoever for her said use and disposal in such
way and manner as she may think proper after my just debts and
funeral expenses shall be paid I do also give to my said Wife Mary
Ann Dunbar the sum of One hundred pounds Stock being part of the
five hundred pounds Stock above stated to be disposed of for the
support of her and my two Children (viz) Lydia Dunbar and Mary
Ann Dunbar provided they shall be both living and the said
Mary Ann Dunbar shall be a Widow at the undesignated periods
(viz) at twelve months after my decease she may have the amount
of twenty five pounds of the said Stock to apply as above stated and

further sum of twenty five pounds of the said Stock also at the
