and testament of me
 Hannah Bentoun of Middlesex widow
 do give and bequeath unto my dear son Robert Bentoun the sum of one
 hundred pounds on his attaining the age of twenty one years and give
 and bequeath all the rest residue and remainder of my personal estate and
 effects real personal and whatsoever which shall remain after payment of my
 just debts funeral and other expenses and the said sum of one hundred
 pounds as above directed to William Benjamin Bentoun of Barrow place
 Middlesex in the said county of Middlesex to and for his own use and as
 proof for ever and I hereby nominate and appoint the said William Benjamin
 Bentoun sole Executor of this my last will and testament I have hereunto set
 my hand and seal this Eleventh day of February one thousand eight
 hundred and sixtyn Hannah Bentoun (S) signed sealed published
 and declared by the said Hannah Bentoun the testatrix in the presence
 of us who in her presence at her request and in the presence of one another
 have hereunto subscribed our names as witnesses Michael Alberton Esq

 End in the parish of and county aforesaid now in the occupation of Thomas
 Smith with the appurtenances to my eldest son Edward Mule his heirs and assigns
 for ever and I give and devise all that my other copyhold messuage
 or tenement near the clay chimneys and in the parish and county aforesaid
 now in the occupation of William Boulter with the appurtenances to my
 son Benjamin Mule his heirs and assigns for ever Also I give and devise all
 that my copyhold messuage or tenement in the parish of Humberston
 Mule aforesaid now divided into two dwellings and in the parish and county
 aforesaid now in the occupation of Hannah Sales widow and William Godfrey with their or
 respective appurtenances to my son in law William Apollon and Elizabeth his wife
 their heirs and assigns for ever Also I give and devise all that my freehold
 messuage or tenement in Humberston aforesaid now divided into two
 dwellings and also all that my freehold cottage or tenement and shop in a
 street in Humberston aforesaid and nearly opposite to my said last mentioned
 messuage now in the occupation of my daughter Sarah Mule with all and
 every the appurtenances to my said freehold messuage or tenement and the said
 cottage or shop or any of them belonging or in anywise appertaining unto
 her my said daughter Sarah Mule her heirs and assigns for ever Also I give
 and devise all that my freehold messuage or tenement in the parish of
 Humberston in the said county of Bedford at or near a place there
 called the White Willow with the appurtenances to my son in law John
 Morris and Ann his wife their heirs and assigns for ever also I give and bequeath
 to my two sons Edward and Benjamin and to my said two daughters or
 Elizabeth Apollon and Ann Morris the sum of fifty pounds of lawful money
 of Great Britain and to my grandson William Apollon who now lives with
 me the sum of ten pounds of lawful money to be paid to the said five
 legatees respectively by my Executor hereinafter named at the expiration
 of twelve calendar months next ensuing my decease but without any
 interest in the mean time and as to all my ready money and securities for
 money now in the public funds debts and care of debt stock in estate
 and
