Proved at London with a Codicil 1st April 1815 before the Judge by the Oath of Justice Law Officer of William Law Esquire & others one of the Estates to whom a commission was granted being first sworn by common duty to admit power reserved to Sarah Westland &c the above also & other Exhibits

I Joseph Ventum Christian by the Names of Joseph Thomas a Son of William Ventum of the County of Middlesex Appraiser & Auctioneer being at present in health & of sound & disposing mind & memory & understanding do make this my last will & testament in manner following that is to say first principally I commend my Soul to God who gave it & my Body I commit to the Earth as it shall be lawfully buried in White Chapel Church Yard at the direction of my executors & unless I shall have any particular directions in writing under my hand & concerning the same And as to my worldly Estate as God of his goodness has bestowed upon me I give & dispose in manner & to the uses & intentions (that is to say) I give & bequeath all & every my & my wife's Lands & Tenements & Heres & of Heres Lands & Tenements whatsoever & wheresoever situated & being as well as freehold as Copyhold & leasehold unto my Sister Thomasa Daughter of White Chapel Road aforesaid Appraiser & Auctioneer & my Mother Hannah his wife to hold to them for & during their natural lives & for during the natural life of the survivor of them provided nevertheless that such survivor does not intermarry again and then immediately after the decease or intermarriage of said survivor I give & bequeath all & every my said freehold Copyhold & leasehold Estates unto Davidah Daughter of Middlesex in the parish of Saint Pancras Spitalfields in the County of Middlesex aforesaid & John Saunders of Canotte Street in the parish of Saint Mary White Chapel in the County of Middlesex aforesaid & their heirs & assigns for ever upon the several Trusts & for the several uses intents & purposes hereafter expressed & declared of & concerning the same that is to say Upon Trust & for the use & intent & purpose that they the said Davidah & John Saunders their heirs & assigns should & lawfully do as soon after as possible either by public Auction or private contract as may be thought best for the benefit of the said freehold Copyhold & leasehold Estates & the profits arising thereon equally divide between my Sister the Widow of Robert Saunders deceased & my Brother Thomas & Joseph Ventum Esquire of the said Davidah & John Saunders & William Ventum or the survivors of them in case more than one shall survive or the whole proceeds thereof to such survivors & in case of the intermarriage of my said Sister the said receipts & receipts alone to be a sufficient discharge or discharge notwithstanding such Coverture as my will & mind is that her share is not to be subject to the Contract Debts or other engagements of any Husband she may hereafter think proper to intermarry I give & bequeath (after all my Debts & funeral

I do hereby nominate constitute appoint my Father Thomas
Denton & my said Brother William Benjamin Denton of
Barrow place Mile End Road in the County of Middlesex
Gentlemen joint Executors of this my last will & Testament lawfully
revoking all wills & testaments by me heretofore made declaring this
to be my only last will & Testament In witness whereof I have
signed set my hand & seal the sixth day of June in the fifth
year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord George the
fourth by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great
Britain & Ireland King Defender of the Faith & in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & eight. Joseph Denton
Signed sealed published & declared by the said Joseph Denton the
Testator as & for his last will & Testament in the presence of us &
also at his request in his presence in the presence of each other
