This is the last Will and Testament

of me William Bool of number 12 Rowell Cottages Wilton Road Simlira in the Parish of Saint George Hanover Square in the County of Middlesex whose Marry being of sound mind memory and understanding at the time of making the same first I direct that all my just debts funeral and testamentary expenses may be fully paid and satisfied by my Executor hereinafter named and appointed as soon as conveniently may be after my decease I give bequeath and bequeath unto my dear wife Elizabeth Bool my share in the House West London and several Building and Furniture Society Act of number 165 of Lane Street East London standing in my dear wife's name and numbered 178 unto my dear Wife for her own sole use and benefit I give bequeath and bequeath unto my said dear Wife as much furniture beds or beds bedding and bedding clothes and other articles and things of value I may be possessed as may be necessary for her comfort or relief she may require and it is my express will and desire that my said dear Wife shall take what furniture clothes articles and things she may require and the rest residue and remainder shall be equally divided between my two sons Charles Bool Esq. Boole and my daughter Matilda Gibberwood Esq. and share alike I give bequeath and bequeath unto my said two sons Charles Boole Esq. Boole and my daughter Matilda Gibberwood my share in the House West London and several Building and Furniture Society standing in my name and numbered 174 and that my said two sons and daughter shall contribute equally in the payments to the Society towards the monthly calls and that my said two sons and daughter shall participate equally in all profit and gain arising from my said share numbered 174 as aforesaid share and share alike and it is my express will and desire that the House Slipping and Tarpauling belonging to me now living in No. George Rowell's House and premises shall be sold and the proceeds arising from such sale shall go and be expended in or towards my funeral and if anything shall remain after payment of my funeral such balance shall be expended in payment of any debts which may be owing by me I give bequeath and bequeath unto my brother John Boole of Manchester in the County of Somerset all my clothes hats shoes and boots and I do hereby nominate constitute and appoint my said dear Wife Executrix of this my Will and Testament hereby revoking and making void all former Will and Wills by me at any time heretofore made and declare this only to be and contain my last Will and Testament my intention and desire of the said Testator William Boole have to this my last Will and Testament contained in one sheet of Paper subscribed my name and set my seal this Twenty first day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and fifty six

William Boole (L.S.) signed and acknowledged by the said William Boole the Testator as and for his last Will and Testament in the presence of us being present at the same time read at his request in his presence and in the presence of each other have accounted subscribed our names as witnesses the words introduced on the document hereinafter recited forth and signed him from the bottom of the first side of this sheet having been marked by the Testator

Proved at London the 28th August 1856 before the Reverend Thomas Spiers Doctor of Laws and Jurisconsult by the oath of Elizabeth Boole Wife the said the sole Executrix to whom a power was granted having been first in person duly to absent.

and assigns to and for his and their own use and benefit the residue
I have at the foot or end of this my last Will and Testament signed my name
this fiftenth day of March. One thousand eight hundred and fifty six

and testamentary expenses be paid and satisfied as soon as may be after my decease
I nominate and appoint my brother Henry Bowen of Stenton aforesaid
Esquire and his son Henry Bowen of Stenton in the County of Great
Oseway Executors and Trustees of this my Will I give to my Wife Elizabeth
Bowen all my furniture and effects (except money and securities for money) and
what shall be in my said Cottage at the time of my decease) absolutely I give
and bequeath unto the said Henry Bowen and Henry Bowen and their heirs
all that my freehold Cottage situate near the Fox Run in the Parish of Stenton
aforesaid together with the outbuildings yards garden and appurtenances there-
unto adjoining and belonging and now in my own occupation and all the in-
struments, records and documents belonging to the said Cottage and the said
Henry Bowen and Henry Bowen their heirs and assigns to the use of my
said Wife and her assigns for and during the term of her natural life and I
direct that my said Wife shall keep the said Cottage buildings and fixtures in
good repair and properly insured from loss or damage by fire and from and after
the decease of my said Wife to the use of them my said Trustees and the
survivor of them and the heirs or assigns of such survivor upon trust to pay
the rent, taxes (after payment of all necessary expenses for keeping the same
repairs and insurances as aforesaid) or suffer the same to be received by my daughter
Margaret Bowen during her natural life for her sole and separate use and
independent and free from the control debts or engagements of any and
bank with whom she may intermarry and from and after the decease of my
said daughter to the use of all and every or such one or more exclusively of
the others or either of her children or remoter issue for such estates or such in
obedience and subject to such limitations and provisions in favor of them or any
of them as my said daughter shall in her will or single appointment by
some writing under her hand and in behalf of such appointment to the use
of all and every the children and heirs of my said daughter living at her decease
and the issue of such of them as shall have been in her lifetime leaving law-
ful issue (such issue notwithstanding to take only the share to which each of
the parent would have been entitled in case he or she had survived my said
daughter) equally to be divided between or among them as tenants in common
and in default of such issue of my said daughter to the use of my daughter
the said Henry Bowen his heirs and assigns for ever I give and bequeath all
my stock and securities in the Public Funds of Great Britain now standing
in my name in the books of the Bank of England and all the rest and
residue of my real and personal estate and effects whatsoever and
whenever unto and to the use of the said Henry Bowen and Henry
